- curriculum enhancement through projects about specific cultures/communities, drawing on pupil suggestions, own experiences, or those of their families, utilising personal links e.g. RRR events, Fund raising (Comic and Sports Relief, Children in Need, Rainbow Centre, Anti-bullying Week, Local Food Bank, The Rotary Shoebox appeal, The Lions re-cycling scheme, Modern Foreign Language Days, Bluey Club, Choir link with local care homes.
