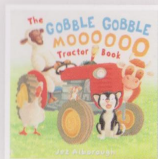

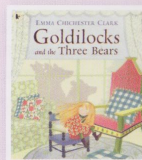


Gobble Gobble Mooooooo Tractor Book

A simple re-telling of the classic fairy tale with humorous pictures to share.

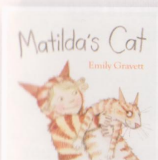
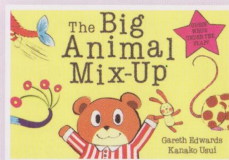


Rhyming Rabbit

A split page book with fold out flaps that introduces children to animals. Lots of opportunity to talk about what is going to be hidden behind each flap.

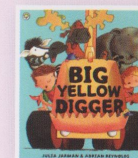


Matilda's Cat

An exuberant adventure in which two children dig their way to Australia, picking up a host of animals on the way. Lively story, told in rhyme, perfect for sharing.

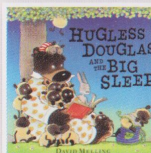
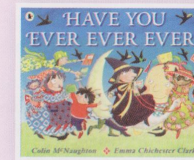


Zoom Rocket Zoom!
