## Chitty Chitty Bang Bang Flies Again

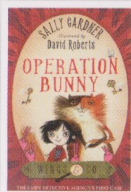
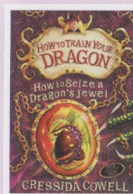
Frank Cottrell Boyce

## Operation Bunny

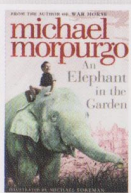
Sally Gardner

## Elephant in the Garden

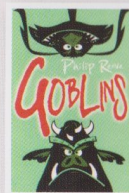
Michael Morpurgo

## Goblins

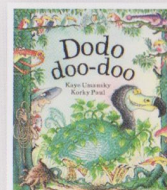
Philip Reeve
