English – Writing

In English, our units will link to our topics. We will be starting the year studying the text 'Street Child' by Berlie Doherty.

Our class reader will also link with our History unit on the Victorians: Oliver Twist.



Maths



In **maths**, we will begin by continuing our work on fractions that we started last term. Following this, we will be using multiplication and division in calculations; we will be introducing quicker, formal methods. Further to this, we will be exploring the short method for division including 'bus stop'. Later, we will move onto covering decimals and percentages. These methods will rely on children's quick recall of timetables facts. Any further practice or support you can give your children with their times tables at home would be appreciated.

Home Learning

Your child will continue to receive home learning each week. These tasks should take approximately 30 minutes each and will be given out on a Friday, to be handed in on the following Wednesday. Your child will be given spellings each week, which they will practise every day in school and they should practise these at home too.

In addition to this, children should still be reading regularly - please remember you can login to your 'Sora' accounts with the Library Service, where they can easily discover a wide range of books. The children also need to continue to practise their multiplication tables, 'Times Table Rockstars' is a great way to do this.

Science
