Understanding the world

This term we will be learning about farm animals in preparation for our trip to Longdown Farm. We will be asking questions and using information books to help us find out more so that we can become little farmer experts!

Later in the term we will be learning about people who help us within our school and local community. This will include visits from some emergency services and a trip to the post office!

As the Summer holidays draw near, we will reflect on how much we have learnt in Year R and start to get ourselves ready to transition to Year One!

Literacy

We have now learnt most of the sounds that we cover in Year R and we'll have lots of opportunities to apply these sounds in our reading and writing.

We will be trying to read simple sentences that include HRS words and we'll be writing labels, lists, cards and simple sentences. Please keep practising at home as it makes a big difference to children's confidence.

Look out for new sounds and words from June onwards.....

Maths

Now that we have a secure knowledge of numbers to 10, we will be focusing on learning number facts such as bonds to 5 and 10, doubles, odds and evens. We will begin to count out loud to 20 and beyond so that we can start to see patterns within the number system.
